2-silbige Adjektive auf -er und -ow: -er – est:

clever – cleverer – the cleverest

Sonst: Steigerung mit more & most:

colorful, more colorful, the most colorful.

5) DESCRIBING PEOPLE AND ACTIONS

useful words:

<u>height:</u>	small, of medium height, tall
<u>weight:</u>	skinny, slim, of average build, slightly overweight, fat
<u>face:</u>	blue/ green/ brown eyes freckles, wrinkles beard, moustache glasses, braces
<u>hair:</u>	bald, short, long, straight, wavy, curly, spiky, bun, ponytail, pigtails blonde, red, brown, black, grey, dyed, highlights
<u>clothes:</u>	cap, hat top, t-shirt, blouse, shirt, pullover, jacket, anorak hot-pants, shorts, trousers, jeans skirt, dress shoes, trainers/ sneakers, boots, sandals, flip-flops, high heels, socks
